FINAL JUDGMENT

This Court having granted the Motion for Summary Judgment in favor of Plaintiff, The Society of Lloyd's ("Lloyd's") and against Defendants in the above styled caused, finds as follows:

1. The English Judgments described in the Complaint and entered against Defendants in England on December 21, 1998 ("the English Judgments") are final, conclusive and enforceable, and entitled to recognition and enforcement under the Uniform Foreign Judgments Recognition Act, D.C. Code §§15-381-388 (the "Recognition Act"), in the dollar equivalent amount of the Judgments.

2. The English Judgments are subject to enforcement in the United States in the following amounts (the "Judgment Amounts Owed"):

A. Gillian Mary Siemon-Netto: UK £278,542.44, converted to U.S. Dollars as of the date of this Judgment, plus interest thereon at 8% from December 21, 1998.

B. Uwe Siemon-Netto: UK £86,470.76, converted to U.S. Dollars as of the date of this Judgment, plus interest thereon at 8% from December 21, 1998.

3. The Judgment Amounts Owed should be converted to United States Dollars as of the date of entry of Judgment.


It is thereupon, ORDERED and ADJUDGED:

1. Lloyd's shall have and recover from Gillian Mary Siemon-Netto, the sum of \$513,630.52, plus interest at 8% from December 21, 1998 through November 4, 2004 in the amount of \$241,590.38, for a total sum of \$755,220.90, for which execution shall issue.

2. Lloyd's shall have and recover from Uwe Siemon-Netto, the sum of \$159,451.82, plus interest at 8% from December 21, 1998 through November 4, 2004 in the amount of \$75,000.30, for a total sum of \$234,452.12, for which execution shall issue.

3. The Court reserves jurisdiction to award Lloyd's taxable costs upon the filing of subsequent Motion.
