Air Recovery Unit Sets Encampment
The 916th Air Force Recovery Squadron, based at Westchester County Airport will hold its annual summer encampment July 7 to 22. The squadron serves one of a chain of similar installations at private airports throughout the country designed to repair distressed airplanes unable to reach an Air Force Base in the event of a national emergency.
As part of the recovery exercise for the year and one-half old group, a C-119 bomber will fly in from Hanscom Air Force Base July 10 simulating a plane in distress. The 916th unit composed of a hundred volunteer reservists from the Westchester area will demonstrate its recovery capabilities and be rated against other units in the region.
